- 2. Possesses strong organizational skills of short and long term planning and time management.
- 3. Has strong communication skills and technological competence.
- 4. Seeks to minister to all the youth in our church family, including those who do not regularly attend youth activities, by developing personal relationships with the youth.
- 5. Manages youth ministry budget and record keeping, and submits an annual report for review at the congregational Annual Meeting.

Accountability

- 2. Sets the mission and values for youth ministry with a plan to carry it out.
- 3. Promotes regular social events--varied in place and purpose—that are outreach and service oriented.
- 4. Recruits and trains volunteer leaders to help with our mission and reflect our values.
- 5. Seeks to minister to all the youth in our church family, including those who do not regularly attend youth activities, by developing personal relationships with the youth.
- 6. Builds and maintains quality relationships with parents.
- 7. Networks with other youth workers in the community, and program or attend area events with other youth ministries annually.
- 8. Sets and oversees the youth ministry budget.
- 9. Integrates youth into the life of the church, supporting and participating in the church's vision, worship services and activities.
- 10. Assists in worship and pastoral duties as required by the senior pastor.
- 11. Attends weekly staff meetings for support, updates, and collaboration.
