A PARENT OR GUARDIAN HAS RIGHTS. WHAT TO EXPECT:

- You have the right to know what is happening.
 You will be told if your child has been apprehended
 either verbally or in writing. You will also be told the
 reasons why your child has been apprehended.
- You have the right to consult a lawyer and should contact one immediately if your child has been apprehended. You might find it helpful to involve an advocate such as a courtworker or other support such as a family member or friend.
- You have a right to be in court and be involved in the planning for your child.

 You have the right to speak to a lawyer to find out if a decision can be reviewed or appealed.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- You may be able to visit your child. You should create safety for your child by having healthy visits with them.
 - You can ask for a Family Group Conference.
 - You can identify safe placement alternatives for your child. Safe placement for your child might be with immediate or extended family, a friend, or another safe person. Tell your caseworker of these alternatives for your child.
