



St. Michael's Episcopal School Shood Drive 2020

What is Shood?

Robin Telfian, a St. Michael's parent, oversees a non-profit called Shood (formerly Soles2Share) that is "dedicated to providing new and gently used athletic shoes to homeless individuals and those who are living in poverty in Richmond." St. Michael's is partnering with Shood to collect gently-used shoes and personal care items. Our students will then assemble foot care bags for Shood.

What are we doing?

Students in K-8th grade will collect different items (item prices & locations are from Target). LS students will place their donations in their classroom tubs. MS students will place their donations in the donation bins in the Singleton Hall Library.









<u>Kindergarten and 1st*</u>: Chapstick (\$2.99/3pk in Check-out area) <u>2nd and 3rd*</u>: Foot powder (\$0.99/item — Toiletry Travel Section) 4th and 5th*: Nail clippers (\$0.97/item — close to nail polish) 6th-8th Grade: Athletic Shoes (men/women, new or gently used)



All Students - hotel samples:
An additional collection of hotel shampoo, conditioner, lotion, etc.
may also be put in your child's LS classroom tub or

the small plastic tub in the MS library.

* K-5th grade students may also bring in new or gently used adult athletic shoes to the donation bin in the Front Lobby of Hubbard Hall.

When are we doing it?

February 3 - February 25, 2020 (end of school day)

In addition to the donation drive, our effort will include the sorting of 5,000 sock donations by our Middle School students and an assembly of foot care bags following the Ash Wednesday service on February 26th. The foot care bags will include the items collected by K-5th grade and notes written by our students.



St. Michael's Episcopal Church has also been supporting this effort through providing storage for the overflowing donations Shood continues to receive.
