Reading

The required summer reading is *The Liberation of Gabriel King* by K.L. Going. Families may purchase or borrow the novel. Students should be ready to discuss their understanding of the setting, plot, and characters upon return to school in August. Having a personal copy for these activities is beneficial. In addition, students are expected to complete the **Summer Reading Bingo Board**. Boards can be found on the St. Michael's website under Community. Please bring completed Bingo boards to the first day of school. Families may access the online fifth grade book list for summer reading suggestions.

Writing

Summer is a great time to keep a journal filled with activities, travels, fun, and personal thoughts. It's a terrific way to improve writing skills, develop voice, and practice grammar skills.

Math

Students should complete at least 8 tasks on the **Math Activities Bingo Board**. Fact fluency is necessary for higher-level computation and problem solving. Rising fifth grade students are expected to know multiplication facts through 12x12 and their related division facts. Students may wish to practice these facts over the summer and are welcome to use IXL for this purpose and for additional skills practice.
